We come to the autumn 2019 edition of the Careers Network Newsletter. You will find the latest news and events, updates from the Careers & Enterprise Company plus other activities and initiatives taking place across our area. The next edition will be in January.



**During July, young** people in North East Lincolnshire told us what issues were important to them in our annual consultation.

Almost 300 young people shared over 500 issues they would like on the ballot papers this September. The top 10 issues for young people in our area are:

Mental Health – improving awareness of and access to services for young people

Knife Crime / Violent Crime - raise awareness of and reduce incidents of knife crime and violent crime

Exam Stress - targeted support for young people during key times

LGBT+ and Gender identity - support for young people who identify with these groups

Life Skills - ensure that there are a range of options for young people to learn the skills they need for life

Votes at 16 - enabling 16 and 17 year olds to vote

More activities for young people to do in the area

Make transport for young people cheaper

Reduce poverty

Reduce bullying

We will be asking schools, colleges and youth projects to give young people the opportunity to vote during September. The results help inform priorities for the Youth Action group and will be shared with North East Lincolnshire Council and partners to gain their support for action to improve the priority issues our local young people decide are the most important.

Daily drop in service for young people aged 16 to 19 offering information, advice and guidance on employment, education and training opportunities

Monday to Friday 10.00am to 12.00 noon and 1.00pm to 4.00pm (3.30pm Friday).

In addition to YPSS other services operating from this building include the following:

National Careers Service helps people aged 18 plus get the advice they need for future skills, careers, work and life choices including one-to-one careers guidance, the use of specially designed diagnostic

tools and group workshops.

The team also offer specialist redundancy support and work closely with Job Centre Plus.

**Building Better Opportunities (BBO)** matches funding from the European Social Fund to tackle poverty, promote social inclusion and drive local jobs and growth for the 25 and above age group. BBO has operated in our area for the last 3 years and has just been granted an extension.

**Employability Coordinators** are based in the Family Hubs and engage with the local community to ensure education and training provision is put in place to meet demand/need and as a signposting service to other support services. This is through working in partnership with education providers and employers to devise suitable training and supporting learners with additional needs, to access training.
