The Women into Manufacturing and Engineering (WiME) programme

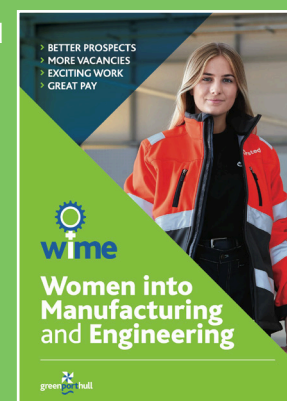
WiME's aim is to encourage women and girls to choose a career in manufacturing and engineering. It started as a Green Port Hull initiative and is supported by North Lincolnshire, North East Lincolnshire, East Riding and Hull City Councils, private sector companies, Jobcentre Plus and the National Careers Service.

Since launching in August 2016, WiME has engaged with women and girls, to help them understand career opportunities in the manufacturing and engineering industries. The initiative has put them directly in touch with a huge variety of the Humber's employers ranging from small software houses to large multinational firms. It has given them a better understanding of the roles that exist, allowed them to meet with women doing this jobs, gain a better understanding of the different career routes into the sector and provided assistance in applying for jobs and accessing training programmes.

Ørsted launches New Visitor Centre at East Coast Hub in Grimsby

Ørsted have launched a new Visitor Centre at the East Coast Hub in Grimsby. The centre will be used as a place to inspire young people to find out more about the renewable energy industry, with organised visits from local schools, colleges, and community groups.

Ørsted are developing programmes that utilise this new space and will be offering a variety of visits, to reach even more young people. The Visitor Centre opens the door into the hidden world of wind energy and the world leading industry on our doorstep. The centre ensures Ørsted connects with the next generation and provides careers to aspire to.

At the opening, guest of honour, Ethan Ginley, eight years old, attended with his parents. Earlier this year, Ethan sent Ørsted a letter and accompanying picture expressing his love for offshore wind turbines.

Ethan's letter and passion are great examples of the next generation seeing offshore as an exciting career. Ethan's brilliant letter is now displayed on the wall as a reminder to colleagues of the importance of what they do today for the next generation, and it was remarked that Ørsted would love for Ethan to join them one day to be part of the team.

Darren Ramshaw, Head of UK East Operations, said: "Our workforce is growing, and we are offering new opportunities for young people to aspire for a career where they can make a difference, they can apply their love of STEM subjects to a real-life job. The visitor centre is the next big step, we've been here almost a decade, and made some fantastic partnerships and friendships. Heard of Youth Action before?

Well if you haven't, keep on reading. It's a local youth council for young people aged from 13 to 21, where all members are voluntary. The group are a part of the national Young Advisor's Charity, which supports groups like our Youth Action council, across the country.

Each month the group gathers at the Grimsby Town Hall to discuss and make plans for a number of projects which aim to support important issues for young people in North East Lincolnshire – this ranges from improving accessibility to cheaper public transport like buses, to developing services to support young people's mental health.

Our local Youth Action council is currently recruiting members to join their ever-expanding social action group – in fact, the group is now inviting possible new members to an event expected to take place this Spring. We received over 8000 votes in this year's poll of Your Voice, Your Vote - an annual consultation of issues in our local area where our young people get their opportunity to vote for the issue they believe is most important to make change.

These votes each year influence local priorities and actions which are then sent to the British Youth Council/UK Youth Parliament.

The votes are in for this year's top issues... A staggering 1 in 4 people found feeling safe on our streets to be the top issue for them (25%), while 1 in 4 (20%) voted mental health (particularly loneliness and isolation) as the second most important issue.

As a result of these being voted top, we are exploring how we can create a Safe Spaces scheme for young people around our area. Keep your eyes peeled for updates on this exciting venture throughout the year!

Apprenticeship Support and Knowledge (ASK) programme

The ASK programme offers every educational establishment in England (with students in Years 10 to 13) access to 4 free, bespoke support packages to transform apprenticeship and vocational education awareness every academic year.

The sessions include activities that allow students, parents, carers, teachers, careers advisers, and governors to be informed about the wonderful opportunities that are available. All the activities and workshops delivered through ASK are inspiring sessions that are delivered by local experts on behalf of the Department of Education. Activities have been designed flexibly so that they can be delivered as a face to face or virtually, depending on what works best for your school/college.

Types of support:

- Support in delivering activities with young people who may be at risk of unemployment, for example, awareness presentation and application/employability workshops.
- Support in delivering activities that will inform teachers, career advisers and parents about the career and training options available.

- Support in delivering training workshops and presentation to local authority teams to ensure they are equipped with the latest information about apprenticeships, traineeships, and T-levels.

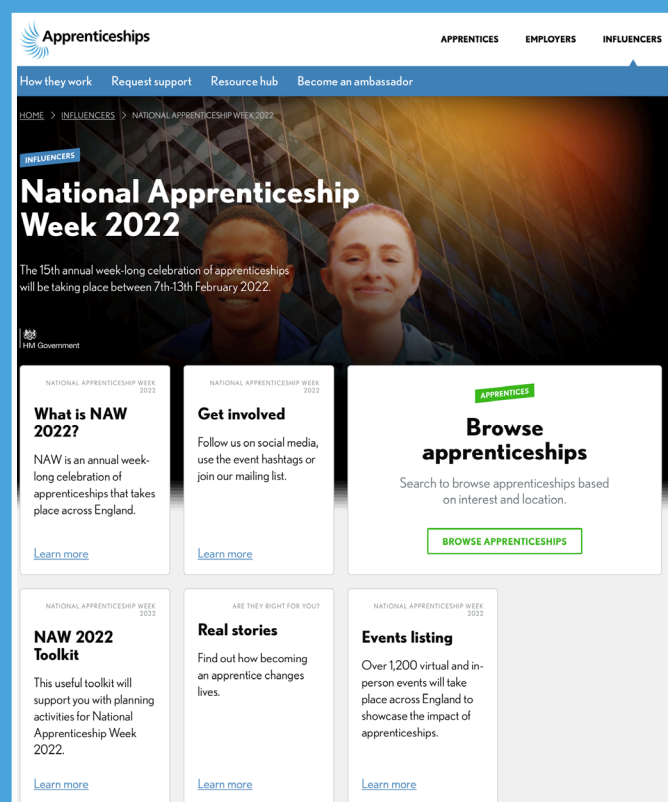
National Apprenticeship Week 2022
