Humber Outreach Programme

HOP - the Humber Outreach Programme - have been working with HE providers in the Humber region to deliver outreach programmes to young people across Hull, Scunthorpe, Grimsby and the East Riding. As part of Phase Two of the National Collaborative Outreach Programme (NCOP), HOP have been continuing delivery in the region while supporting local outreach provision. By working together with local providers, HOP are aiming to build a network of effective and impactful outreach for schools and colleges.

This year with a renewed focus on central team and partner delivery, HOP are designing a new core offer for schools. This new offer - paired with a robust Progression Framework, mapped against the NERUPI learning outcomes and Gatsby 8 - aims to provide schools with bespoke programmes to accurately suit the needs of both the school / college and the students, ensuring that young people are at the heart of the design and delivery of the programme. Alongside this, HOP are developing an online Hub to act as a central point of access for resources, contacts and more fantastic local outreach provision.

Employability Passport

Andy Crossland from the Humber LEP attended a meeting in the autumn, to brief schools interested in the Employability Passport about the accreditation process with two accreditation panels provisionally planned for the spring and summer. Just to add that as the Employability Passport is located within the Lincs2 website, students using the passport must be at least 13 years of age, to enable a Lincs2 account to be set up.

The Passport has been endorsed by key local employers: ABP, Care Plus, DWP, Engie, Orsted, Seachill and NELC.


Youth Voice Matters
