Accelerate programme for young people 15+



Aspire-igen has recently been awarded the ESF contract for 'Accelerate', a programme that will be delivered across North East Lincolnshire as well as in North Lincolnshire and East Riding.

The Accelerate programme is available for young people aged 15+ in schools, and who are at risk of becoming NEET, as well as supporting school leavers who are NEET. Key workers are able to deliver on a group and /or one to one basis providing non

regulated and regulated guided learning hours to meet the young person's needs. Also included are opportunities for work experience and pathways into apprenticeships and traineeships as well as offering a bridge to encourage continued education.

Employability Passport

As part of the Humber Local Enterprise Partnership's (LEP) commitment to improve the level of employability skills in the region, an 'Employability Passport' framework has been developed based on the CBI's (Confederation of British Industry) seven employability skills:

- Self-Management
- Teamwork
- Business and Customer Awareness
- Problem Solving
- Communication & Literacy
- Application of Numeracy
- Application of ICT

To date 25 organisations have achieved success in the pilot in the Humber region and some academies in North East Lincolnshire are keen to produce a collaborative passport. North East Lincolnshire Council – YPSS team are required under the Education Skills Act to receive these cohort lists in order to meet the statutory government return for the purposes of the:

- Intended Destinations
- September Guarantee
- and our tracking responsibilities

The following legislation from the Education and Skills Act 2008 provides information for Academies/ Providers **www.legislation.gov.uk/ukpga/2008/25/section/72** confirms the duty on education providers to provide Local Authorities with information:

Relevant information about a pupil or student who is attending an educational institution in England must be provided by the responsible person to a person involved in the provision of services in pursuance of section 68 on a request by that person.

Careers Leaders

- You will receive a detailed pre event briefing a few weeks before the Skills Fair, detailing the exhibitors and layout of the venue, that can be used to prepare your students
- YPSS Careers Advisers are able to come into school either for groups/assemblies to deliver sessions to students about the Skills Fair and how they can get the most from the event
- 'Have a go' theme, so students can try different activities to see what they enjoy
- Programmes will be delivered to school in the week before the event, so that you have them to give to students in advance

Students should be encouraged to:

- Ask as many questions as they can
- Take their time, don't rush around
- Not to go round in large groups, pairs is ideal
- To try and talk to everyone – they never know what they might find out
- To go to all the different areas: Auditorium, Leisure Centre Sports Hall, Marquees

WiME is a Humber based programme led by industry to drive positive change in terms of gender balance in the workplace. Women make up less than 10% of the UK engineering workforce and this is a sector with a

significant skills gap. We find that the girls who visit the events really benefit from hearing first hand from the women who are already working in these industries as well as having a go at engineering activities to test skills and grow confidence.
