The Phillips 66 Humber Refinery Challenge

After a two year absence we are delighted that the North East Lincolnshire Skills Fair for year 10 students, is returning to Grimsby Auditorium this summer, with planning well underway and many key local employers exhibiting at the event.

This event is the largest skills and careers event in NEL with the aim of inspiring young people from the borough to make decisions regarding their future career and the skills they will need. The event is organised by a partnership of Franklin College, Grimsby Institute, DWP and NELC Young People's Support Services.

Phillips 66 is sponsoring the STEM Village within the Skills Fair and in addition its Humber Refinery will be launching a competition in May challenging students from around North East Lincolnshire to develop their understanding of how individuals and corporations can reduce their environmental footprint. A handful of selected winners will have the opportunity to develop their thinking further, presenting their innovative solutions to how we can transition to a lower carbon future at the Skills Fair.

The prizes will include £1000 for the winning teams school and an invitation to the Humber Refinery for work experience. Runners up will get £500 for their school.

Full details of the competition will be released in May.

The ambition is to expand the GL Careers Hub to all secondary schools, colleges, SEND and PRUs.



The Greater Lincolnshire Cornerstone Employers

Cornerstone Employers work with networks of schools and colleges to improve careers education, make sure key skills for their sector are understood by teachers and education leaders, inspire students, champion jobs in their local area, and, importantly for the business, enable visibility of their organisation within their locality.

Cornerstone Employers connect at a national level and are supported by LEPs and the Careers and Enterprise Company to work strategically within the career's education landscape. There are over 200 Cornerstone Employers nationally.

The Greater Lincolnshire Group is chaired by Heather Lee, Head of People at Lincolnshire Co-Op. Our Cornerstone Employer Group are made up of SMEs, large employers, private and not for profits and are from a range of different sectors. They are committed to work with their networks, the wider business community and their local team to make sure that young people in our region have access to the career opportunities they need. The group came together on 12 April to make plans to support the hub in the following areas:

- Amplifying apprenticeships and apprenticeship opportunities
- Train the Trainer BM4 CPD for teachers and teacher externship opportunities
- Employer CPD for preparing to support SEND young people, increase BM 5 and BM 6 opportunities.



Career Hub Initial Focus

The current Careers Hub schools met in March and discussed how as a Hub we will support all Gatsby Benchmarks, with a specific focus on:

- CPD to support BM 1
- Create localised resource to support BM 2
- · CPD and resource to support BM 4
- Streamlined approach to the Give an Hour campaign. Schools to send dates they need support, with outcomes defined and the Hub will run a campaign to attract and match volunteers
- Raise awareness and ensure accessibility to both actual work experience and virtual work experience opportunities.

Something to celebrate!

We have reached **100** volunteer Enterprise Advisers to support our schools and colleges across our network.

Working with a local school or college, our Enterprise Advisers help shape young people's futures by working with the Careers Leader and the wider senior leadership of the school or college to create opportunities for young people and bridge the gap between education and employment.



Peer Research Voluntary Opportunity – get involved

Anyone aged 16+ can get involved in a fantastic voluntary opportunity where they are interviewed as part of a research project being conducted by University College London.

North East Lincolnshire Council has partnered up with UCL to investigate what it is like from a younger person's and an older person's perspective to grow up in a coastal town, and how this develops our community.



The Professionals page on the SEND Local Offer is getting an upgrade. The page will be the first page in a new restructure to make the website easier to navigate and will include more pictures and videos.



The Quality in Careers Standard is the national careers quality which is aligned with Gatsby Benchmarks.

Statutory guidance from July 2021 strongly recommends all schools work towards the Standard to support the development of their careers programme. A key aspect of the Standard is the integration of CEIAG into the curriculum and achievement of the Gatsby Benchmarks, demonstrating a holistic approach to CEIAG.

The Standard will:

- · Demonstrate to Ofsted that a high standard has been reached
- · Assist quality assurance of CEIAG
- Develop and improve your provision by providing a framework to audit against
- Raise the profile of CEIAG at strategic and operational level
- Encourage employer engagement, work related learning and employability skills
- Demonstrate you fully meet or are making good progress towards meeting the 8 Gatsby Benchmarks

The Raising Aspirations Project

The Women In Manufacturing and Engineering (WiME) team has recently been working with women from locally based companies and four Humber schools to run a pilot project with small groups of Year 10 girls over a period of 6 months, to help them to:

- identify their strengths when applying for jobs
- understand the amazing opportunities open to them in STEM based industries here in the Humber
- · ensure they have the tools needed to become the best they can be



Initially the girls had two sessions with Ørsted and then a full day at Ørsted's East Coast Hub on the Port of Grimsby where over 500 people operate the largest offshore wind projects in the world and which is only two miles away from Havelock Academy. Lots of different roles in the wind industry were showcased, from Offshore Coordinator to Commercial Manager to Wind Turbine Technician Apprentice and the girls were able to meet the real women in these jobs.

The packed agenda included various exercises and opportunities to learn about the Humber jobs market alongside exploring their own skill sets, but most importantly they got to speak to some amazing role models throughout the day and experience a real place of work.

Primary Futures is a programme from the charity Education and Employers, seeking to raise children's aspirations and broaden their horizons. This free programme has been developed by teachers, for teachers, and connects schools with inspiring role models from the world of work.

This year especially, motivating children and showing them a wide range of possibilities linked to their futures is vital. We know this helps to inspire the children we work with. Recent research from Education and Employers shows that starting early with career-related learning is key to social mobility, helps children see value in core subjects, and challenges stereotypes that form at an early age.




Young People's Support Services (YPSS) has moved!!!
