Transition to adult life
Preparing for adulthood (PfA) Preparing for adulthood is a process that all proofs goet from only for them there are been being a transition and become an adult.
It is an exciting time, but we know that this can be a difficult time for some young people and their tamilies; including those with special educational needs and disabilities (IBND) complex physical or mental health needs; those with care needs; their parently/cares and young cares;
For these young people and their parents or carers, the preparing for adulthood process can need more thought and careful preparation than for other young people of a similar age, due to changes in the services and support they have known throughout childhood.
The process will be personalised to your needs and individual situation. Planning and preparing early will help make it a more positive experience. It will also help maintain your will being, build confidence and independence for moving into adulthood.
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There are places available for the next academic year on the <u>Children Challenging Industry</u> (CCI) programme. CCI is led by the Centre for Industry Education Collaboration (CIEC) based at the University of York, in partnership with CATCH and our industrial partners.

This unique project provides a range of stimulating science activities set in industrial contexts designed to enhance primary school children's understanding of science and industry. The total cost of running the project for each school is over $\pounds1,500$. However, due to the financial support of our industrial partners, the total cost to your school would be just $\pounds300$.

CCI includes two half-day classroom sessions, run in-person by the CCI advisory teacher, plus one wholestaff CPD session. Remote options may be offered to schools on request. The class teacher is required to run a 'middle' session for which the CCI advisory teacher provides plans and resources. Young People's Support Services

Young People's Support Services (YPSS) Level 6 qualified Careers Advisers provide free impartial information advice and guidance to targeted students in key stage 4 across all academies in North East Lincolnshire and also attend some meetings for students in year 9 where possible.

We also offer additional purchased services such as careers guidance for students who fall outside our targeted service offer and single or 3-year destination tracking reports to assist academies with meeting responsibilities covered in the Careers Strategy and Gatsby Benchmarks.

YPSS hold the Matrix international standard for information advice and guidance services offering reassurance as to the quality of the information advice and guidance (IAG) given to young people.

Early in the summer term Rachel Reeve from the Management Information team will be making contact with academies to request cohort lists, potential NEETs and SEN support students who will need continued education support into year 12. This forms an important part of our tracking duties, so we can align services accordingly and also ensures accuracy of year 12+ destination reports.
