Hope on the Horizon - New vessel Wind of Hope arrives in Grimsby

Ørsted recently welcomed the arrival of its new Service Operations Vessel (SOV) Wind of Hope. Up to 60 of Ørsted's wind turbine technicians will call the 84-metre vessel home for two weeks at a time, whilst they work out in the North Sea on the world's largest wind farms.

The SOVs are integral in keeping employees safe and healthy whilst at work. The Wind of Hope has a modern gym, cinema room, hospital and accommodation for 90 people, plus onboard chefs who keep the technicians energised and healthy.

Wind of Hope has been conducting sea trials as it gets ready to work out at the Hornsea sites in the North Sea. Although primarily intended for use during operations at Hornsea Two, set to become the world's largest offshore wind farm on completion in 2022, the vessel will first be used at Hornsea One wind farm – the world's current largest.

Darren Ramshaw, Head of Ørsted's East Coast Operations in the UK, said: "It's a very exciting time

to be part of the offshore wind industry in the UK. By the end of this year, we will have invested over £13 billion building UK offshore wind farms.

Updated Statutory guidance for Schools and Colleges on providing Careers Guidance (July 2021)

This updated guidance is for governing bodies, school and college leaders, careers leaders, colleges and local authorities and applies to:

- students in school from year 8 to year 13
- all students in college up to and including the age of 18
- students aged up to 25 with a current education, health and care plan

There has been no change to careers legislation, however the document brings together statutory guidance for schools, further education colleges and sixth form colleges on careers guidance into a single document, setting out the duties to provide careers guidance and covers how careers guidance features in the Ofsted Education Inspection Framework.

Greater Lincolnshire granted Careers Hub status by Department for Education

Greater Lincolnshire has become one of a new wave of Careers Hubs, which were recently announced by the Department for Education and The Careers & Enterprise Company.

The Greater Lincolnshire Careers Hub will consist of approximately 34 local schools and colleges, working together with local employers such as Lincolnshire Co-op, Triton Knoll, and Bakkavor.

It is the next stage in expansion for the existing Enterprise Adviser Network, which was founded in 2018, and is funded by the Careers and Enterprise Company, North East Lincolnshire Council, North Lincolnshire Council and Lincolnshire County Council. The programme will be managed by the Greater Lincolnshire LEP team.

Working as a partnership with schools, colleges, employers, local district councils and other local organisations, Careers Hubs have accelerated levels of support and improvement in young people's career development nationally.

Schools and colleges will have access to a dedicated Enterprise Coordinator, an expert in the Gatsby Benchmarks and the local labour market. In addition, a new 'Hub Lead' will co-ordinate activity and build networks with local businesses. The Careers Hub will be allocated a central fund to support employer engagement activities, and training for a Careers Leader in each school and college.

Evidence published by The Careers & Enterprise Company in October 2019 showed Careers Hubs accelerated overall careers education progress and performance by 56% in 12 months.

Greater Lincolnshire Online Jobs and Careers Fairs

The Greater Lincolnshire LEP is hosting free online Jobs and Careers Fairs each month on a virtual platform. Take a look at the website here: www.greaterlincsjobsfair.co.uk

Since November 2020, 4,400 visitors have attended the live fairs, with the website receiving over 90,000 hits since it launched and the event is free for all exhibitors and participants. Typically we welcome around 70 exhibitors per fair.

In between the live events, the website remains public, so that visitors can return to browse the information about different organisations and look at the virtual exhibition stands.

The next live fair will take place on Wednesday 29th September from 10am-1pm and then on Wednesday 27th October.




Our workshops and events are open to all carers who help children and young people who need support or have Special Educational Needs and Disabilities (SEND).



Curriculum support workshops

Parents and carers are invited to join one or more of the new monthly curriculum workshops at Central Family Hub from 9:30am-11:30am.

The workshops are aimed at providing the skills needed to help their child in key areas like reading, writing and maths as well as soft skills to help them get organised and stay focused. Also invited are SENCO's, teaching assistants and/or pastoral support workers.

- Tuesday, 23 November- Language
- Tuesday, 14 December- Maths
- Tuesday, 25 January- Handwriting and movement skills

We will also be holding regular pop-up events with professionals from SEND services, health and social care.

Parents matter, but so do other adults who look after children too. From foster carers to grandparents, we have used the term 'parents' as shorthand for all these different carers. Our workshops and events are open to all carers who support children and young people with SEND.
