## Humber 2023 Schools Sustainability Challenge – now launched

After the success of the Sustainability Challenge judged at last year's Skills Fair, Phillips 66 and new partner Hull KR Foundation have launched this year's challenge. The challenge is open to teams of up to 5 students from Years 9 or 10 (or a mix) who are invited to take part and come up with creative ways to support the country's net zero ambition.

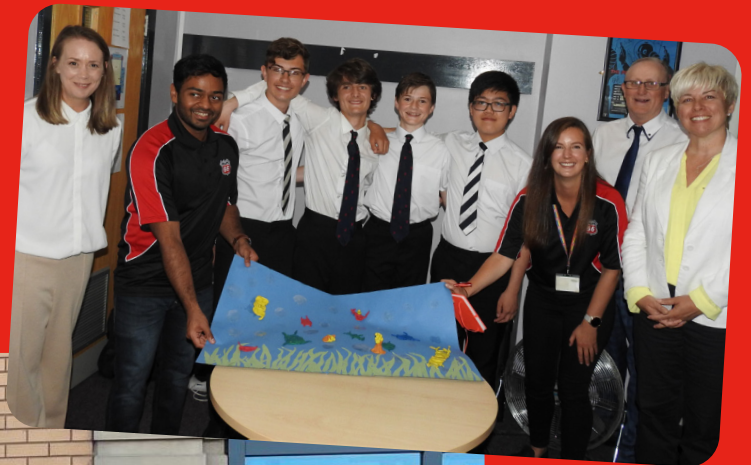
There are three rounds and this year's finalists will be invited to showcase their work at the Waterline Summit on the 13th November, in front of the judges, academics and business leaders from across the region.

The winning team will claim a fantastic £5,000 to support STEM activities and sustainability efforts within their school. The students will also win a trip to the Phillips 66 Humber Refinery to learn more about their decarbonisation journey, as well as the Phillips 66 London office and a tour of Parliament to see where all the decisions on the UK's energy transition and decarbonisation are made. The students will also be invited as VIP guests, for a visit to Sewell Group Craven Park stadium where they will watch the first team train,

grab some autographs and enjoy a Stadium tour.

Paul Fursey, UK Lead and General Manager for the Humber Refinery added "As part of the Phillips 66 Limited Humber Refinery's journey to become the Refinery of the Future, it is key that we continue to engage students of all ages, across our region to help inspire them to join STEM careers and as importantly to think about the future. It is them that we will be passing the baton to – it is imperative that they continue to think about decarbonisation and what is needed for the region and the world to reach its net zero ambitions."

3. Provide an opportunity for SEND careers professionals to network and share best practice

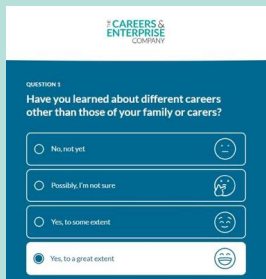
For those careers leaders working in mainstream or FE this group will be open to those working as a SEND coordinator to help connect their work to careers education

Young People's Support Services

Young People's Support Services (YPSS) Level 6 qualified Careers Advisers provide free impartial information advice and guidance to targeted students in key stage 4 across all academies in North East Lincolnshire and also attend some meetings for students in year 9 where possible.

We also offer additional purchased services such as careers guidance for students who fall outside our targeted service offer and single or 3 year destination tracking reports to assist academies with meeting responsibilities covered in the Careers Strategy and Gatsby Benchmarks.

YPSS hold the Matrix international standard for information advice and guidance services offering reassurance as to the quality of the information advice and guidance (IAG) given to young people.

As we enter the new academic year Rachel Reeve, YPSS' Management Information Specialist will be making contact with academies to request cohort lists so we can align services accordingly and ensure we have an accurate cohort information.

If you teach Maths in a state-funded school or college in England, your school is already served by a Maths Hub, which is able to support you by offering fully-funded CPD. The Yorkshire and Humber Maths Hub serves North and North East Lincolnshire.

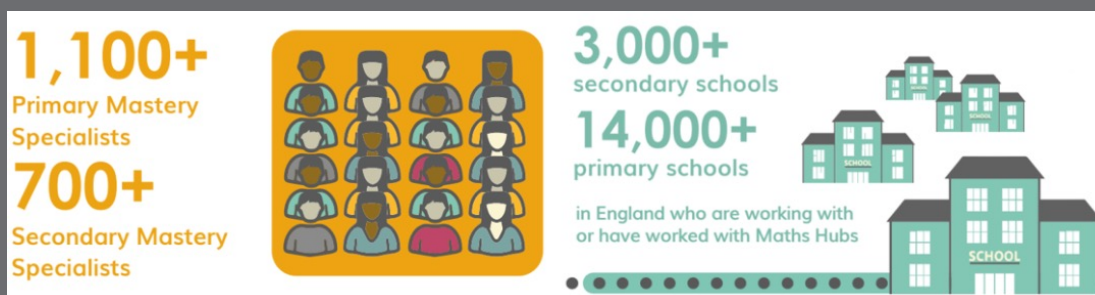
Each Maths Hub is led by a dedicated team of Maths specialists (many of whom still teach regularly) and has a highly skilled network of accredited LLMEs (Local Leaders of Mathematics Education).

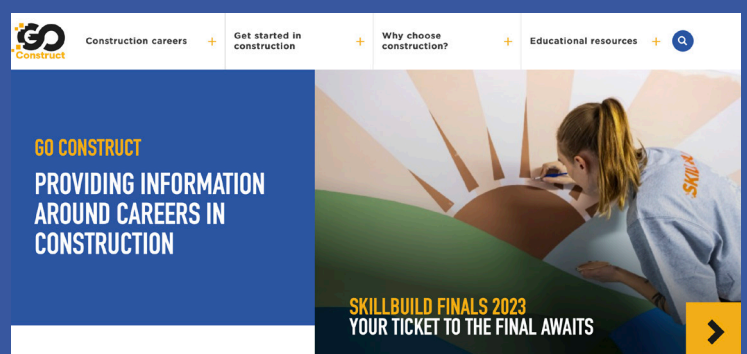

## Your Voice Your Vote consultation

Your Voice Your Vote is the annual consultation by young people for young people to ensure we are representing and sharing the issues young people identify as their priorities, to improve our local area.

The results of the consultation are shared with local councillors and senior managers who provide the services relating to the top issues voted for, to influence further discussion and action. For example last year 'places to go and things to do' as well as 'feeling safe on the streets' were top issues and further discussions revealed that there were limited places young people felt they could go for support if they feel unsafe.

Since sharing this the Young and Safe team have engaged with a group of young women and developed and launched the #askforhaven scheme where a number of youth friendly venues are available to support young people who feel unsafe, they just need to ask for Haven. The CATCH Welding & Pipefitting Hub is an employer-led project to ensure that the region has the right level of skills to meet the demand not only of existing projects in the process industry sector but also to enable the UK to deliver the mega-scale engineering construction projects that industrial decarbonisation of our industry requires.
